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Hello parents and carers Staff and students are all working hard this term to consolidate student learning.

Working in the COVID-19 environment has made it necessary to change many of our procedures.

teachers are working on arrangements for the Year 6 Farewell. At this

point, parents will not be invited into the venue. Students will also not be allowed to dance. However, the good news is the Farewell can go ahead and students can celebrate the end of primary school and the beginning of high school. At the present time, parents are not permitted to attend the annual Presentation Day. Students will attend the occasion in their Stage groups to ensure physical distancing. The event will be videoed and made available to parents on the school's website. We have made a slight change to the awards that can be presented to students. Where students are in a composite class for example, 3/4X, an academic award will be presented to a student from each grade instead of just one student from the class. This makes the arrangement more equitable for all students.

Thank you to the families who returned their survey notes about priorities for the next school plan which will be called a Strategic Improvement Plan (SIP) and will cover the years from 2021-2024.

The SIP will include 3 Strategic
Directions for school improvement.
The department has set one Strategic
Direction for all schools called "Student
Growth and Attainment". Each school
in NSW has targets to meet for
students' reading and mathematics
improvement.

You told us that student wellbeing and support for individual learning needs was important to you and we agree, so the second Strategic Direction is "Student Wellbeing". I am continuing to consult with staff about a decision for our 3rd Strategic Direction.



Thank you also to the families who returned our survey about student reports. In the first survey about school priorities, you told us that improving the way we report student progress is important to you. We would like to hear more from parents about your views for improving student reports. If you are willing to be interviewed about your ideas please complete the slip further on in the newsletter and return it to your child's teacher.

Anglican (Protestant) scripture classes are now available at the school. If your child is not currently attending a scripture class, he/she will receive a note. If you would like to opt in to a scripture class please return the note to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

The school has received some information about funding and staffing for 2021. The school has been allocated an additional teacher for 4 days per week to support students from a language background other than English to receive extra help. This is excellent news and will help students develop their English skills to an academic level. The executive team has also been discussing plans for improving the school's internet capability and purchasing more iPads and laptops for students' use.

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
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Kindergarten Enrolments 2021
